

WHAT IS THE FLORIN JACL SACRAMENTO VALLEY?

The Florin JACL is a grassroots Asian American social justice leader in the Sacramento region born in the 1935 Florin community. Historically, this was an area of 2,500 Japanese Americans, mostly strawberry & grape-farming families.

The World War II incarceration of 120,000 innocent Japanese Americans in concentration camps deprived them of their freedom, homes, farms and businesses. Although few Florin residents remain in their pre-war homes today, the community spirit and strength live on within this common history.

Now in the 21st century, the Florin Chapter continues to lead through involving its members and supporters. Current efforts continue in civil and human rights, preservation of Japanese American culture, promoting public education about our history, social events, and many other activities.

People have recognized our Florin JACL Chapter with awards over the past 30 years including the Sacramento Human Rights Commission award, JACLer of the Biennium, JACL Chapter of the Biennium, and Interfaith Award from the Muslim community. These achievements are due to the tireless dedication of our members. We continue to encourage new members of all backgrounds and ages to join our active and friendly group.

WHY JOIN?

- **LEADS ON CIVIL AND HUMAN RIGHTS ISSUES:** The Florin JACL has stood up for the rights of Japanese Americans and others over its 81-year history. It led efforts to desegregate the Florin East Elementary School in 1939, pass and fund redress from 1988 to 2000, campaign against hate crimes including the 1993 and 1999 Sacramento firebombing attacks and 2007 murder of gay Fijian American Satendar Singh, and organize support for Americans of Muslim, Arab, and Sikh backgrounds unfairly blamed for the 9/11 attacks.
- **PROMOTES NIKKEI HISTORY:** The Florin JACL sponsors education about the experiences of older generations and the vital lessons they provide for today's America. Projects include the 80 Florin Oral History Project books and helping to organize the CSU-Sacramento Japanese American Archival Collection. Also, 33 years of Time of Remembrance programs including the annual N. California "Uprooted" exhibit with other JACL Chapters at the California State Museum reaching thousands of students each year since 2003. Additionally, the Florin JACL sponsors the annual pilgrimage to the Manzanar WWII concentration camp with the local Muslim American community.
- **ORGANIZES SOCIAL-CULTURAL ACTIVITIES:** We strongly promote Japanese American heritage and community building. The annual scholarship and youth fundraising dinner and bingo night is ever popular as is the Ice Cream Social. The annual "Mochi Madness" traditional rice cake pounding and Obon Dance Workshop with the Buddhist church of Florin are real crowd-pleasers.
- **ADVOCATES FOR YOUTH & FAMILY PROGRAMS:** Besides several fun cultural programs already mentioned, the Florin JACL provides Youth leadership activities. This includes a scholarship program for students, college campus visits, community tours, and youth conferences.
- **AND MUCH, MUCH MORE . . .** The Florin JACL also proudly sponsors annual programs on women's issues, multi-racial concerns, and world peace.
