What is the AkaMya Culture Group

AkaMya is an amazing Native American cultural group for dance, drumming, song, story-telling, and much more. In 1998, Sage Romero founded AkaMya in in the Paiute-Shoshone Tribal Reservation of Big Pine, 30 miles from the former Manzanar concentration camp.

AkaMya promotes heritage, including an annual Manzanar Culture Exchange showcasing Native, Japanese and Muslim American dance, drumming, and song during the Florin Manzanar Pilgrimage since 2016. Over 200 pilgrims have seen this moving event cosponsored by the Florin JACL-SV and Council on American Islamic Relations - SV/CC (CAIR). AkaMya and others welcomed us to their community when sometried to exclude us in Bishop

How is the Culture Studio Progressing?

After 4 years of grass roots effort with volunteers, donations, and small grants, AkaMya's Studio nears completion and aims for a dedication in May. They still need to build a dance floor and an outside restroom.
